If you choose to participate in the research by filling out the survey, please check the appropriate box at the bottom of the page. Do NOT sign your name. If you choose not to participate, please check that you do not agree to fill out the survey. [Do not read the following sentence if you're speaking to an ESL or ENL class] If you feel more comfortable filling out the consent form and survey in Spanish, please raise your hand.

# Give students 1-2 minutes to read and fill out the informed consent form. When everyone is finished, say the following:
